This summer you will read 2 books and complete a project for each book read.



The adventures of a mouse, Stuart Little, as he sets out in the world to find his dearest friend, a little bird who stayed a few days in his family's garden.



TALES OF A FOURTH GRADE NOTHING By Judy Blume


The story focuses on a 9-year-old boy named Peter Warren Hatcher and his relationship with his 2-year old brother Farley Drexel.




BEEZUS AND RAMONA

Assignment

Summer Reading is a requirement for students attending Nazareth Elementary. Choose two of the books you have read and complete an assignment for each of the books. You must do a different project for each book.

- 1. Create a diorama using the characters and setting in the book. In addition you are to write a summary explaining your diorama and include important information about the book. Be sure to include the title and author.
- 2. Design an original book jacket for one of the books you read. Write a 5 sentence paragraph that summarizes the book. Include the title and author. <u>You may type or write the summary neatly.</u>
- 3. Write a letter to the author or one of the characters in the book. Let the person know what you liked or did not like about the book. Include questions you would like your person to answer.

<u>Summer reading credit will be part of the first Quarter ELA grade.</u> <u>Completed work is due the week of Sept. 4-6, 2019</u>

Copies of the summer reading books are available at the public libraries throughout the Monroe Public Library System. Although there are copies of each title, our school may not be the only school requiring students to read a particular title. You may also choose to purchase your own copy of a book.
