*The local libraries have several copies of the books or you may choose to purchase your own.

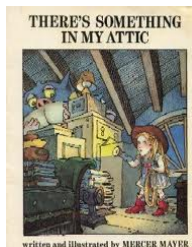

By Don and Audry Wood

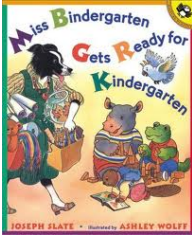

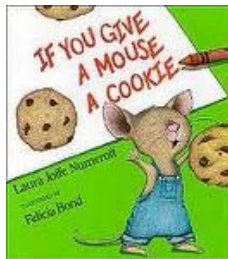
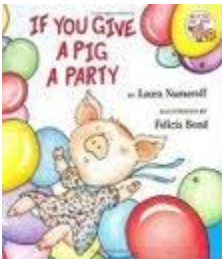
