Curriculum

Music - A well-rounded music program is provided for PK-6 students. In addition, Grades 3 and 4 learn to



play recorders, Grade 5 the keyboard, and Grade 6 the guitar. All grades experience Chorus once a week and perform in Christmas and spring concerts.

Library - All students visit the library weekly for library skills, research, and literature lessons. Through this program, our students in Grades 3-6 participate in the annual city storytelling competition.

Technology - Students learn keyboarding, technology skills, safe Internet use, Word, Powerpoint, Excel, and more in the lab. A SmartBoard is used for instruction in every classroom. Computer stations, iPads, laptops, and Chromebooks are learning tools used at various grade levels and in the AIS program.

Academic Support - Academic Intervention Services (AIS) are provided for students in K-6 needing extra support in reading, writing, and/or math.

Tutoring - Free tutoring is offered after school all year by dedicated faculty.
